URGENT NEED FOR DISASTER RELIEF FOR HAITI

A magnitude 7.0 earthquake has struck already-impooverished Haiti. Several major aftershocks have continued to damage the country. As many as 1/3 of Haiti's nine million people have been affected. The expected death toll could reach tens of thousands.

How can I help?

- Continue your prayers for all our friends and loved ones in Haiti.
- The most immediate need is money. To donate to relief funding through The Advance, please provide checks to your local Methodist church or conference, payable to “The Advance” with “Haiti Emergency, Advance #418325” in the check memo line, OR *to speed your giving to those in need*, go directly to the GBGM Advance Giving website for the Haiti Emergency Relief and follow the instructions given there: <http://secure.gbgm-umc.org/donations/umcor/donate.cfm?id=3018760&code=418325>
- Health kits are needed. Please see the following for instructions on preparing the health kits: <http://new.gbgm-umc.org/umcor/getconnected/supplies/health-kit/>. Please provide as many kits as you can to your local church. The kits will be gathered by the churches into designated warehouses within each UMC conference, for shipment to UMCOR's depot (Sager Brown) for transport into Haiti. If your church needs to know where kits are to be ware-housed in your conference, please contact your Conference Coordinator. The coordinators for each conference are given (third bullet item) on the South Central Jurisdiction's UMVIM website: www.umvimsdj.org.
- Importantly, UMCOR asks that you DO NOT stockpile clothing for relief at this time. All warehousing and transportation resources must first be utilized for medical supplies, health kits, and other items essential to help stabilize the situation.

URGENT NEED FOR DISASTER RELIEF FOR HAITI (Continued)

- UMVIM teams will be needed to help with restoration, re-building, and other needs—BUT, at a later time. As with all natural disaster situations, no teams will be dispatched until government and military personnel have assessed that areas are deemed safe and secure. GBGM/UMCOR will advise when UMVIM teams will be allowed in—the Haitian government has placed a moratorium on volunteer efforts until a later date to be announced. Our UMVIM teams must meet UMCOR’s specific Haiti Relief criteria: teams must have a leader with Team Leader training; teams should have previous experience working in Haiti; and, importantly, teams must be self-sufficient (must carry their own camping gear, food, water, emergency supplies, etc.).

NEW MEXICO OPPORTUNITIES (NEW)

The Four Corners Native American Ministry (FCNAM) would like to thank all of our supporters for a strong and successful year in 2009! As we head into the new year, the 2010 ministry budget has been established at \$199,450, an increase of \$21,880 from 2009. The budget increase largely reflects two additional ministry goals for 2010. First, the FCNAM will be sending 40-plus Navajo youth to summer camp at Sacramento Methodist Assembly this June. Second, the increase reflects a priority to improve the compensation for a number of Navajo ministry staff and church workers. Your undesignated financial contributions help us accomplish our locally-set ministry goals. With your support, we are looking forward to another strong year. While most of our 2010 mission team calendar is already full, there remain important but limited opportunities for adult and intergenerational groups (max. 20 persons). Available projects include: fencing at Dowozhii Bikooh (Utah), VBS and heating/electrical system repairs at Pinedale near Gallup, VBS at Roughside near Sheep Springs, NM (end of July) and plumbing repairs at Shiprock UMC. UMVIM TEAM TRIP REPORTS

KATRINA RELIEF – METHODIST’S STRONG COMMITMENT (NEW)

Haati immigrated from Tonga about 20 years ago, where he was a bus driver. He lives in Salinas, California, is married with three children and is an active member of the First UMC there. Haati is a roofer by profession and is a constant volunteer in all types of ways within his church, community and the California Nevada Annual Conference. Every Sunday morning he works in his church kitchen preparing meals for the homeless. He participated in numerous UMVIM teams, has replaced numerous roofs in churches and parsonages in California and has been trained by UMCOR as an Early Responder.

After Katrina struck in 2005, Haati responded within the first week to Louisiana. He was so impressed with the experience he wanted to go back and do more. He said, "I have been so blessed by God in this life that I must give back in his name." He resolved to replace a hurricane damaged roof for each year of his age; he was 46 at that time. Haati returned to the Gulf Coast over a dozen times since Katrina, and in total replaced 46 roofs that had been destroyed by the hurricane. He shares that on one trip to New Orleans he left home Christmas eve and took his son, then eleven, with him. They spent that night in the airport in route to do another roof. He said "Me and my son together when we got there did five roofs by ourselves before we came home." "The other teams had prepared the roofs and had all the materials there so we could just put those shingles right on, one house after another."

Since he has had another birthday, he resolved that it now had to be 47 roofs. So he accompanied an UMVIM team from California that was headed to New Orleans for their project. As they completed their project, Haati found and repaired roof number 47, on January 14th, 2010. The Louisiana Conference held a special celebration for Haati, recognizing his personal achievement and his enormous contribution in the Katrina restoration effort. **See accompanying pictures of Haati and his 47th roof!**

NOMADS GROUP COMPLETES WORK AT WESLEY FOUNDATION (NEW)

NOMADS members have completed work at the Wesley Foundation at the University of North Texas in Denton, TX. Over the course of three weeks, the team successfully renovated the kitchen and several other areas of the facility. When NOMADS arrived the kitchen had been stripped down to the bare walls, even the floor and ceiling tile had been removed, ready for the team to set to work. Painting was the first chore and painting continued to the hall and office area also. Cabinets were put together, and installed after the new ceramic tile was installed in the back porch, kitchen, and entrance area. New appliances were put in place after proper wiring and plumbing was done. New fixtures were installed in the women’s bathroom, and fixtures improved in the men’s bath. A new coffee area was created in the hall way off of the main room and office area, with new ceramic tile in that area, also raising the cabinets to accommodate the refrigerator placed there. New counter top cabinets were also placed in the area for supplies. A new supply closet was designed and built for the entrance area to the kitchen, and bi-fold doors were installed.

This was only one of the sites where NOMADS worked in December. Starting January 11, 2010, the NOMADS will be involved with projects over several states. United Methodist NOMADS are mission volunteers, who travel the country; living in their RV’s doing short term mission work for United Methodist agencies. Their work includes working at church camps, churches, children’s homes, and recovery areas such as Katrina and Ike.
